7th February walk

The weather on February 6th was appalling with sheet rain all day. John Newbould decided that it may be totally unreasonable to go into the muddy fields so arrangements were made to look at mosses and lichens in the garden by the bus stop. We then moved to John's house where he had set up microscopes with samples collected the previous day. Nine people turned up to look at lichens and mosses groups, which most field naturalists turn away from. Keeping things simple, John explained that bryophytes derived from the Greek word meaning mosses may be found in four groups. Sphagnum found in bogs, acrocarps, which grow upright and have capsules at the top of their stems (see picture above); pleurocarps, which form mats with capsules arising from the side of the main stem (not illustrated) and a leafy moss known as a Liverwort. Examples of all three types were looked at under the microscope. Finally we looked at lichens, which are a combination of a fungus and an algae. See picture on the right.

Garden Bird Watch January 2014.

Some very interesting numbers behind January's Garden Bird Watch with heavy rain and strong winds altering birds' behaviour patterns. Some of the more exposed gardens had really low numbers of birds whilst those with shelter from bushes and trees reporting the usual numbers. Bullfinch is again resident half way up Plaisters Lane. Yellowhammer is turning up in gardens, which provide corn. Six gardens reported blackcap, possibly European migrants. There was no fieldfare, redwing or mistle thrush but two gardens had song thrush. A brambling was seen at Wyndings, greenfinch was seen in four gardens.

Jon and Sue Campbell's list from the monthly Wessex Water count included stonechat at two locations with skylark on the Ridgeway along with kestrel, meadow pipet and raven not reported from the

Other wildlife.

Snowdrops were out by late January and lesser celandine and primrose soon followed. Interestingly Jon and Sue turned up small tortoiseshell butterfly on the 14th whilst Janet Craig reported it on the 16th. Dorothy Emblem and Janet reported frog spawn on the 12th whilst I saw my first frog road kill at the junction of Puddledock Lane on the 18th, which I think is a week later than normal.
